There are many more informative videos about the Vikings, as well as almost every other aspect of history, geography, art, science and music. Clearly there is much material on youtube that is unsuitable for children and **they should be supervised** when using youtube.

Pupils could watch the videos and try to make notes about everyday life. Watch the videos several times to try and get as much information as possible. Also download pics of items like the ones you see in the videos.

Pupils could find pics like the everyday objects in the video and if possible put them in a word folder. They should try to draw some of the items and label them. They should then use google and other sources where possible to find 3 important facts about the following topics

- 1) Vikings at home
- 2) Viking trade
- 3) Viking exploration
- 4) The Althing
- 5) Viking religion

Art


The topic for the term is the popular culture of 1980 (and the 1980's)

On the picture sheets are examples of work by **Helmut Middendorf**. Students should cut suitable pictures of people out of newspapers and colour them using felt tips or pastels to try and recreate the style of these pictures

On the picture sheets there are also examples of work by **Keith Haring**. Students can try drawing their own versions of these.

They can also try making prints in the same style by carving a potato block (there are hundreds of youtube videos on how to do this) or by making a printing block from a piece of wood or a kitchen tile and gluing string onto it to make the image. Use a brush, sponge or roller to apply paint or ink to the string and then print onto paper.
